From the South: Creswell (Oregon Ave) to Camas Swale to Hamm Road to Territorial Road. Turn right on Territorial go about 4 miles and destination will be on the left.

From Beltline: W. 11<sup>th</sup> to Greenhill Road. Turn left. Greenhill to Crow Road. Stay on Crow Road until it intersects with Territorial (about 8 miles). Left on Territorial about 5 miles to your destination on the right.

**What to Bring:** Lunch, Chair, Boots (wet, muddy fields), Rain Gear, Gloves, Hunter Orange to wear in the field, Safety glasses, Gun (#8 shot), Hunting License, Stakeout Chain or Kennel, Water, Whistle, Pinch Collar, Leash, Check Cord, Dog Treats, Place Boards if you have them.

## Intermediate Pointer Training is back for its 2<sup>nd</sup> year

This training level will NOT be a competition event but will offer individualized attention according to your dog's training level. This area will be for dogs that have completed the puppy division and know their Come, Whoa, Place, and Heel but are not yet ready to run in braces or if you are new, placement would be determined by club trainers. The emphasis will be on holding point until the bird is flushed, backing another dogs point, and retrieving to hand. For those who would like to train to a higher level, steadiness to wing, shot, and fall can be addressed.

#### Pump and Auto Shotgun Rule Changes:

No pumps or autos will be allowed due to safety concerns on the pointer side.

#### Shells for the new club guns

The club is providing the break open guns for those who don't have them but it is the member's responsibility to bring shells. The new guns are 12 ga.

#### **Brace Rule Change:**

When you reach the line for your brace you must declare to the Judge & Gunner if you are following AKC (Senior/Master), NSTRA rules or if not competing, who will be flushing the bird, gunner or handler.

**AKC:** Please familiarize yourself with AKC standards if you plan on doing hunt tests as your GVHRC gunner may be a NSTRA person. I have attached a few notes that apply to AKC that were provided for clarification.

#### **Senior Dogs:**

Handler flushes the bird and can handle on a back. Gunner may NOT help, cautioned stop to flush on wild flush.

#### **Master Dogs:**

No handling of the dog on back or point dog must be study to wing, shot and fall. Handler flushes the bird. Gunner may not help. Stop to a wild flush.

#### **Gunner:**

Gunner is to be positioned by handler and return to behind the handler after shot.


#### **Both Stakes:**

In either Senior or Master the handler must have a blank gun to be fired on Safety's.

If you have any doubt or questions be sure to ask at the morning safety meeting before competition starts.

#### **BREED PROFILE**

#### Spinone Italiano

Known as the Italian Coarse haired Pointer.



This breed was recognized by AKC in 2000. The Spinone Italiano, or Italian Pointer, is Italy's all-purpose hunting dog. The Spinone Italiano (plural: Spinoni Italiani) is a squarely and solidly built all-around hunter. Spinoni are muscular and powerful, built more for endurance than speed. The dense coat has a natural, unclipped look and comes in 4 colors Brown, Orange, Orange Roan and White. They are 112th in breed popularity.

General Appearance: Muscular dog with powerful bone. Vigorous and robust, his purpose as hardworking gun dog is evident. Naturally sociable, the docile and patient Spinone is resistant to fatigue and is an experienced hunter on any terrain. His hard textured coat is weather resistant. His wiry, dense coat and thick skin enable the Spinone to negotiate underbrush and endure cold water that would severely punish any dog not so naturally armored. He has a remarkable tendency for an extended and fast trotting gait. The Spinone is an excellent retriever by nature.

Training & Temperament: Not Very Active; Walking, an occasional jog, and romping in the yard will satisfy these easy going eccentrics. There's something instantly endearing about these big, idiosyncratic Italians. Calm and a bit goofy around the house, Spinoni have unique habits like trailing water from their beard after a drink, sitting with their butt on the sofa and their front legs on the floor, and sassing their owner with woofs and sighs when they don't get their way. These are very clever dogs, and sometimes stubborn, but great with kids and other animals. Their soulful expression and gentle manner make them ideal therapy dogs.

Grooming: The Spinone is the ultimate wash and wear breed and should remain in a natural state, with just occasional brushing and hand-stripping. Owners beware, however - after a drink, their wet and messy beard may leave trail of water wherever they go!

Health: Like all breeds there may be some health issues, like hip and elbow dysplasia and eye disease. Some dogs may be faced with these health challenges in their lives, but the majority of Spinone Italianos are healthy dogs.



- 1) After the member provides the Board with proof of completion of an approved Hunter Safety Course
- 2) At the Board's discretion.
